

NOTICE OF ENACTMENT OF LAND LAWS

TO : All Members, Shawanaga First Nation

RE: Four Land Laws enacted by the Council of Shawanaga First Nation

Shawanaga First Nation has broad authority to manage and protect its reserve lands pursuant to the Framework Agreement on First Nation Land Management, the First Nations Land Management Act and the Shawanaga First Nation Land Code. This authority includes the jurisdiction to pass Land Laws setting out the principles, rules and administrative structures that apply to Shawanaga First Nation lands.

Pursuant to this authority and in accordance with the procedures set out in the *Shawanaga First Nation Land Code*, the Council of Shawanaga First Nation have, following community consultation, enacted four Land Laws relating to a proposed 230 kV transmission line to be constructed and operated by Henvey Inlet Wind LP on a leasehold parcel of Shawanaga First Nation Reserve No. 17 land. The four Land Laws are:

- Land Law 2017/18-001 SHAWANAGA FIRST NATION LAND REGISTER, enacted 30 September 2017: establishing the Shawanaga Land Laws Register that will consist of a Land Law Archive and abstracts of all Land Laws registered under the Shawanaga First Nation Land Code.
- Land Law 2017/18-002 FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE SHAWANAGA FIRST NATION LAND CODE, enacted 30 September 2017: amending the *Shawanaga First Nation Land Code* to permit the proposed Henvey Inlet Wind Transmission Line on terms acceptable to Shawanaga First Nation.
- 3. Land Law 2017/18-003 ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTED AND PROTECTION FOR THE HIWLP TRANSMISSION LAND LINE, enacted 30 September 2017: governing the environmental assessment, protection, permitting and enforcement procedures and structures that will apply to all projects on Shawanaga First Nation, including the proposed Henvey Inlet Wind Transmission Line.
- 4. Land Law 2017/18-004 SPECIAL LEASE TERMS FOR THE HIWLP TRANSMISSION LINE LEASE, enacted 30 September 2017: incorporating special terms for the proposed lease for the Henvey Inlet Wind Transmission Line.
